This day of discussion and debate will include a panel and six breakout sessions. Speakers include Michelle Terry (Globe Artistic Director), Daniel York (actor and activist) and Athena Stevens (actor, writer and activist).

**Group sessions will include:**

Authenticity and appropriation: who 'owns' the stories being told?

To thine own self be true: should LGBT+ roles only be played by LGBT+ actors?

Holding each other to account: how do we move from a culture of blame to one of constructive scrutiny?

Beyond the capital: how do we resolve the challenges of casting representatively outside of London?

The importance of off-stage diversity: how vital is it for a building to be representative in all departments, and in positions of power?

The talking cure: allowing a space for trauma in our discussions of prejudice.
